- High School Diploma in Alberta:
  - 100 Credits, 109 Credits at St. Dominic High School
- Certificate of High School Achievement(K&E):
  - 80 credits, can transition to a general diploma(may require one extra term)



## Credit Information (continued)

- 5 credit courses: every day per term
- 3 credit courses: every second day
- 1 credit courses: modules; usually Career and Technology Studies (CTS)
- Off-Campus Education Credit Opportunities (Work Experience, Green Certificate, Registered Apprenticeship Program)
